NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market closed irregular today in a state of active trading.
Changes of key stocks were mostly small but a number of specially-cultivated issues produced some wide moves either way.

Dealings were the slowest of the week for most of the session. Some of the aircraft-missile stock continued their advance while one or two faltered. The pattern was mixed among many of the major groups.

Volume for the day was estimated at 4.5 million shares compared with 4.81 million Thursday. Gains and losses of fractions in a gain or a point prevailed among most key stocks.

Wider moves of 3 points or so either way were made among a group of more volatile issues as they responded to speculative demand or sank on profit taking.

Sterling Drug spurred 7 points at best, showing a gain of about 5 in late trading.

Polaron and Litton Industries were up about 3 apiece. Lohm & Frank and Twentieth Century-Fox lost around 3 apiece. Beckman Instruments moved ahead by a half dozen points. Brunswick slipped about 2 and American Machine & Foundry dropped more than a point.

Some of the aircraft-missile stocks continued to gain. Martin Co. gained around a point. Lockheed and Boeing were up fractionally.

DuPont and Liggett & Myers were off about 2 each. A number of leading steels and motors took small losses. Oils, airlines, tobaccos and drugs were mixed.

American Stock Exchange prices were mixed in active trading. Corporate and U.S. government bonds were mixed to a shade lower.

\$125,000 Station Set For 'Strip'

Construction of a new \$125,000 Phillips 66 service station on the "Strip," adjacent to the Stardust Hotel, has been announced by company officials and Jack Cason and Carl Bailey of Las Vegas.

The new station, which will be "Strip" frontage site will be valued at nearly a half million dollars, the eleventh Phillips 66 station to be opened in this area by Cason and Bailey since 1952.

When, as employees in a local service station, they decided to go into business for themselves.

Cason, representing Phillips Petroleum Company, paid \$300,000 for the 150x200-ft site for the new station.

THE LAND, purchased through Campbell Realty Company, was owned by Henry Hunt, a pioneer resident of this city.

James H. Down, Jr., of Campbell Realty represented Hunt in the transaction.

Cason and Bailey started in the local business world when they bought a station from a company that formerly was in business in Las Vegas.

With the earnings from this first venture, Cason and Bailey thereafter purchased two more stations, which they named Saveaway Super Service Stations.

Spurred by the success of their three Saveaway stations, Cason and Bailey conceived the idea of going one step higher in the oil business by becoming local "jobbers."

IN 1958, they became co-jobbers for Southern Nevada for Phillips petroleum products.

Later in that same year, Cason and Bailey opened three new Phillips 66 stations on the same day, at 725 Las Vegas Blvd. No. 1756 Las Vegas Blvd. So.; and on Boulder Highway in Henderson.

ILLEGAL DOPESTERS TOP 10,000 California Narcotics Cited

SACRAMENTO (AP)—California has 10,000 to 20,000 persons engaged in illegal narcotics activities—and some wrong ideas about how they got started and how to rehabilitate them.

The bureau concluded that punishment might have some effect on the non-addict user, but little on the addict-user.

The non-addict, the report said, has "simply taken advantage of a lucrative situation."

Radiological Class Slated

Dr. Simon Kinsman today announced that a new class in Radiological Instrument Operation is being offered by Clark County residents on a tuition-free basis.

Dr. Kinsman is Chief of the Chemical, Biological, and Radiological Defense Section, Intelligence Division of the Greater Las Vegas Civil Defense Agency.

This course for radiological meter technicians is scheduled to begin on Thursday, May 11 and will continue for a total of five sessions. Lectures are to start at 7 p.m., will be concluded at 9 p.m., and are open to the first thirty applicants who possess a minimum of high school education. Devices to be used by the students include beta-gamma geiger instruments, ionization-chamber detectors, and quartz-fiber electrostatic dosimeters.
